Use of Personal Barbecues on <u>Municipal Property</u> Councillor Kirwan asked why a permit is necessary when using personal barbecues on municipal property and what the process is to get a permit.

The Manager of Community Partnerships responded that there is a condition in the Parks By-law that states barbecues are not allowed in parks and that there is currently a review being done to see what other municipalities do in the same situation. He noted most applications for permits are made for special events being held in parks.

Backyard Bonfires

Councillor Vagnini asked if there is a by-law to regulate backyard fires and the materials that can be burned.

The Chief of Fire and Paramedic Services responded the Open Air Burning By-law includes that information.
