NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Greater Sudbury hereby requests that the Minister of Transportation reclassify this section of Highway #17 to a Class 1 due to the high number of motor vehicle collisions, the extremely high number of tractor trailers and heavy equipment travelling this highway daily, and the topography of this section;

WHEREAS MacLennan Drive in Skead begins at the end of MR 86 as it meets Poupore Road East and progresses around a sharp left turn up past Bell Street and continues past the Skead Fire Hall;

AND WHEREAS current winter control procedures list MR 86 from the airport to the Skead Fire Hall as a class 3 major road, and the road north and east of the Fire Hall is considered to be a Class 4 local road and changes to a Class 5 local road as it progresses northerly;

AND WHEREAS plows are typically dispatched to salt and/or sand the Class 1 to 3 road network when the snow fall begins; and once a snow accumulation of 5 cm has been reached on the road surface, the City commences the plowing operation and the City has up to 8 hours after the snow fall ends to clear the Class 1 to 3 roadways of snow;

AND WHEREAS sanding operations commence as soon as icy conditions are detected on Class 4 to 6 roads and are treated within 24 hours of ice detection; and plows are dispatched to plow and sand the Class 4 to 6 road network once a snow accumulation of 8 cm has been reached, and the City has up to 24 hours after the snow fall ends to complete its clearing effort of Class 4 to 6 roadways, which are maintained to a snow packed state;

AND WHEREAS the most undulating and curvacious part of MacLennan Drive lies north of the Fire Hall to its terminus;

AND WHEREAS a petition with nearly 300 signatures was submitted to Council on November 22nd, 2017 requesting that MacLennan Drive from the Skead Fire hall north to its terminus be treated as a tertiary arterial road (or Class 3 road) for Winter Control purposes;

AND WHEREAS the petitioners' request was unfortunately denied in accordance with the current Winter Control Policy;



WHEREAS the Louis Street Community Association (LSCA) was created in 2010 as part of a pilot program in conjunction with Police Services and their Community Response Unit as a means of connecting directly with the residents of the Louis Street complex, to reduce the levels of crime.

AND WHEREAS the Louis Street Community Association has offered a multitude of programs to the residents of the Louis Street Housing Complex at 159 Louis Street (owned and operated by the Greater Sudbury Housing Corporation (GSHC)), and partnered with outside agencies such as the Public Health Sudbury & Districts, Greater Sudbury Police Services, Our Children our Future, Kids Challenge, City of Greater Sudbury programs and public art projects with Myths and Mirrors, to name a few;

AND WHEREAS as a result of the programming offered and the community support outreach that the Community Association provides, there has been a significant drop in the number of calls to the Greater Sudbury Police Service to that location, creating a sense of place, empowering the residents and offering the kids a safer place to live, play and grow up healthy;

AND WHEREAS the Louis Street Community Association had been offering its programming and services from a basement location within the complex, and most recently offered a townhouse complex at 159 Louis Street through a Letter of Understanding and Commitment to share space with Better Beginnings Better Futures, the tenant of the townhouse;

AND WHEREAS on April 5th, 2018, the Louis Street Community Association was notified by the Greater Sudbury Housing Corporation that its permission to use townhouse #224 was withdrawn effective immediately; was locked out through a Trespass to property act order, locks were changed, belongings were seized and stored in an outdoor unheated and locked cube it located near the garbage area; the Association was not given notice, the opportunity to carefully pack donated items including laptops for the tutoring program, craft supplies, etc ...nor an inventory list of what has been packed; with access only to be granted through a request to the Maintenance Manager;

AND WHEREAS the sudden lock out has immediately, impacted 24 children who have been attending the tutoring program since October 2017, the volunteer tutors from Laurentian University who have been volunteering their time and earning practical degree experience with LCSA for the past 6 years, as well as the LSCA craft and local food gardening program sponsored by master gardeners which have been halted;

AND WHEREAS the Louis Street Community Association requires an onsite venue at the Louis Street Housing Complex in order to continue its programming and grassroots community support outreach such as arts and crafts, sewing for adults and kids cooking etc... to all community members regardless of ability;

AND WHEREAS the City of Greater Sudbury is the major shareholder of the Greater Sudbury Housing Corporation;
